## Minors Offered

Baccalaureate degree seeking students are eligible to declare a minor in a variety of subject areas. The number of credit hours required may vary depending on the area in which the minor is being sought. A minimum of 12 credit hours in any minor must be earned at Bryan College of Health Sciences. Students wishing to earn a minor must complete the Declaration of Minor Form and submit it to the Records and Registration Office.

The following outlines the minors offered and the hours required. Please see your advisor for specific course requirements and details.

### **Biomedical Sciences**

Students are required to successfully complete 14 credit hours. (12 credit hours must be taken at Bryan)

### **Gerontology**

Students are required to successfully complete 12 credit hours. (9 credit hours must be taken at Bryan)

### **Healthcare Management**

Students are required to successfully complete 12 credit hours. (12 credit hours must be taken at Bryan)

### **Public Health**

Students are required to successfully complete 12 credit hours and an additional 3 credit hours of choice for an emphasis.

- *Business and Management Emphasis*
- *Cultural, Psychological, and Social Emphasis*
- *Natural Sciences Emphasis*

### **Social Sciences**

Students are required to successfully complete 15 credit hours. (12 credit hours must be taken at Bryan)

### **Spanish for Health Professions**

Students are required to successfully complete 12-21 credits. The goal of the Spanish minor is to achieve comprehensive knowledge of the Spanish language and culture. (12 credit hours must be taken at Bryan)

### **Vascular Sonography**

Diagnostic Medical Sonography students may elect this minor. Students are required to successfully complete 17 credit hours.



## Bryan Bookstore

You will need to register with the bookstore by creating an account. Simply click on the **“my account”** link on the top right hand side of the page. You can then browse for your books by selecting the courses for which you are registered under **“find textbooks”**. After adding items to the cart you will be able to pay by credit card or by utilizing your financial aid funds.

- *Sales tax will be posted to your Bryan College tuition bill for text book purchases made using financial aid. Students paying for text books by credit card are expected to report on their Nebraska Individual Income Tax return “use tax” for purchases made on the internet.*

## Dropping Courses

If you decide to drop a class or withdraw from school you must contact Records and Registration immediately for the appropriate paper work. When you register for a course you assume responsibility for the tuition and fees associated with that course. It is your responsibility to notify the college if you will not be in attendance. Not attending class does not automatically drop you from the roster or cancel your financial obligations.

## Withdrawal Policy

A student who wishes to drop a course after the first week of the semester must withdraw from the course. If a student withdraws from a course before the end of the tenth week of the semester, a grade of “W” (withdrawal) is recorded on the transcript. A withdrawal is not computed in the grade point average. Students who find it necessary to withdraw from a course after the tenth week of the semester must petition to the Dean of the student’s program for permission to withdraw. If approved to withdraw, the student will receive a “WP” (withdraw passing) or a “WF” (withdraw failing) on the transcript, dependent upon the student’s grade in the course at the time of withdrawal. A “WP” or “WF” is not computed in the grade point average. If a student does not petition for a “WP” or “WF”, the course grade will be assigned based on the work completed in class. Any work that is incomplete will be calculated with zeroes. This may result in a failing grade. This failing grade will be computed in the grade point average. **Withdrawal deadlines for courses less than a full semester in length follow a prorated withdrawal schedule.**

## Directory Information

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) specifies the rights a student has in regard to their educational records when they enter an institution of higher education. Directory information may be disclosed without student consent; however, students have the right to withhold its disclosure. Students must notify the Records and Registration Office in writing during the first week of courses if they wish to have their information withheld. Bryan College of Health Sciences has designated the following items as directory information:

- Address of student
- Phone number of student
- Personal email of student
- Field of study (major)
- Academic class (freshman, sophomore, junior, senior)
- Enrollment status (full-time or part-time)

**NOTE:** withholding your directory information does not apply in classroom situations in which you are enrolled, nor does it include the right to remain anonymous in class. Your name and college email address may be listed on a class roster, and you may be called by name in class.

### Dropping and Adding Courses

#### Adding a course

A course may be added through the end of the first week of the semester by completing a "Request to Drop/Add a Course" form and submitting it to Records and Registration. Please contact Records and Registration if you have any questions regarding the form.

#### Dropping a course

A course may be dropped through the end of the first week of the semester. The student must complete a "Request to Drop/Add a Course" form and submit it to Records and Registration. A course dropped by the end of the first week of the semester is not recorded on the transcript. A student who wishes to drop a course after the first week will have a "W" recorded on their transcript. Please see page 8 for more information on the withdrawal policy.

The drop/add dates for courses that are less than 16 weeks are prorated. You may contact Records & Registration for further details. (Also see page 20 in the registration guide for Financial Policies)

## Grading System

Throughout individual courses, grades are recorded numerically to two decimal places. The final numeric course grade is then calculated and recorded as a whole number. Letter grades are assigned according to the final numeric value. Grade point averages are computed as follows:

# Registering for Courses

If a student has a registration hold placed on their account, their registration will not be processed until that hold has been resolved. All questions regarding holds should be directed to the Registration and Records office at 402-481-3805.

## Registration Categories

### Priority Registration:

Is reserved for current students.

### Open Registration:

Is offered to new students and students who have not been accepted into a program of study at Bryan College of Health Sciences. This category also includes non-degree seeking students who wish to take courses for their own personal or professional development.

## Registration

- Contact **your advisor** for assistance with the registration process. Your advisor's contact information is on the Student Portal.
  - Your advisor will assist you in identifying the correct courses based on your curriculum.
- You are responsible for checking registration holds. All registration holds must be cleared before your registration will be processed.
- Use a new "Course Registration Form" for each semester.
  - Be sure to complete all sections on the form.
  - Be sure to get your advisor's signature.
    - Your registration will not be processed if parts are missing.
- Once you have met with your advisor turn in the white copy to Records and Registration in office 224.
  - You may keep the pink copy and give the yellow copy to your advisor.
- If you are a hybrid or online student, you may fax your registration form to 402-481-8621 or scan to your advisor.

## Undergraduate Enrollment in Graduate courses

Students in the senior year of their major at Bryan College of Health Sciences may elect to enroll in a maximum of six graduate credits providing that all of the following criteria are met:

- Current Bryan College of Health Science undergraduate GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- Permission of the graduate course faculty member.
- Space availability upon registration of current graduate program students.

## Basic Nursing Assistant Information

The first day of class is **mandatory**. Students who do not attend the first day of class will be automatically withdrawn from the course.

### Cost

\$499

Total cost of the course is \$499. This total includes your tuition, fees, student manual, student workbook, and a **\$50 non-refundable** registration deposit. The deposit will be applied to your tuition once attendance has been recorded.

## Requirements

Must be at least 16 years of age.

All paper work is sent out a month prior to the start of the class or at the time of registration and is due **PRIOR** to the first day of class to allow time to process background checks and health records.

### Background Checks

This will be completed on the first day of class. If you are a minor you will need your parent's signature on the following forms:

- *Completion of Authorization and Disclosure Form for Criminal Background Check.*
- *Completion of Nebraska Health and Human Services Abuse Registry Form.*

### Immunizations

Documentation of immunity to the following communicable diseases must be provided **PRIOR** to the first day of class. Failure to submit documentation will result in automatic withdrawal from the course.

  - *Rubella—3-day measles, German measles*

\$563/credit hour

## Course Description

This course introduces the practice and theory of phlebotomy. It includes ethical and legal issues that pertain to phlebotomy, laboratory safety, basic anatomy and physiology, types of laboratory specimens, specimen handling, and special collection procedures. Practical instruction includes venipuncture and capillary blood collection. The curriculum is designed to provide the didactic information and competencies required by the American Society of Clinical Pathology for certification as a Certified Phlebotomy Technician. *Please note that there is no certification at the end of this course. You will have the 3 credit hours of education and most job sites will do onsite training.*

## Requirements

All paper work is sent out a month prior to the start of the class. This paper work is due **PRIOR** to the first day of class.

## Tuition Payment Policy

Tuition and fees are posted to student accounts during the second week of a new semester and are due upon posting. Statements are provided online through CampusVue Student Portal (Navigation: My Finances > Account Information > Registration Bill (check term and click search)). A student who is delinquent in the payment of tuition and fees will be refused admission to additional courses. An official transcript will not be issued until a student has met all financial obligations to the college.

## Tuition Refund Schedule

- *Refunds to tuition will be issued according to the table below.*
- *Refunds for summer sessions or sessions less than a full term will be prorated.*
- *Refunds will be processed within one month of the request.*
- *Enrollment fees, course materials, lab fees, and books purchased through the bookstore are nonrefundable.*
- *Dropping classes may affect your financial aid, loan eligibility, or car/health insurance.*
