

The applicant has the right to:

1. Be treated in a nondiscriminatory manner on the basis of race, ethnicity, color, national origin or ancestry, religion, sex, genetic information, gender identity or expression, age, marital or family status, pregnancy, sexual orientation, disability, veteran status, source of income, or any other protected class recognized by state or federal law.
2. Be treated with dignity and professionalism.
3. Accurate information about the application process and requirements, DNAP program curriculum and outcomes, and College policies and procedures.
4. Communicate with program administration if they so desire.

The applicant has the responsibility to:

1. To be truthful and honest.
2. To inform the program of changes in contact information.
3. To notify the program in a timely manner if they wish to withdraw their application.
